Curbside Recycling

Single Stream Recycling: All recyclables can be mixed together.

Do not put recyclables in plastic bags! Call your Public Works department if you need more recycling buckets (Hopewell Twp. 609 537-0250, Hopewell 609 466-0168, Pennington 609 737-9440).

Accepted Materials in Curbside Recycling Bucket

- Mixed paper, office paper and window envelopes
- Corrugated cardboard (flatten boxes)
- Telephone books and "soft" cover books
- Hard cover books (remove hard cover and put in trash)
- Glass, food and beverage jars/bottles (all colors)
- Aluminum and metal beverage containers, pet food cans
- Milk jugs, plastic beverage bottles, detergent and shampoo containers
- Juice boxes and juice/beverage cartons
- Plastics with a ♻️ or ♻️ symbol.

Materials Not Accepted in Curbside Recycling Bucket

- PLASTIC BAGS and plastics with a ♻️, ♻️, ♻️, ♻️ or ♻️ symbol (but see "More Ways to Reuse or Recycle" for plastic bags and film, and for ♻️ plastic).
- Pizza boxes
- Light bulbs
- Aluminum foil/baking pans, bandage tins, cookie tins
- Drinking glasses, dishes and broken window glass,
- Ceramics and pottery
- Aerosol cans, motor oil and anti-freeze containers
- Clothes hangers (but see "More Ways to Reuse or Recycle")
- Carbon and waxed paper
- Tissue paper, napkins, paper plates and paper towels
- Styrofoam (but see "More Ways to Reuse or Recycle")

More Ways to Reuse or Recycle

Batteries - Button/Cell: Pennington Farmers Market (see “Events”).

Batteries - Rechargeable: Home Depot, Lowe’s.

Bikes: NJ Bike Exchange, bikeexchangenj.org/donate-your-bike.html

Brita Products: Pennington Farmers Market (see “Events”).

Cell Phones: phone companies and electronics stores.

CFL Bulbs: MCIA Household Hazardous Waste Collection (see “Events”), and some stores, e.g., Home Depot and Lowe’s.

Clothes and Shoes may be: 1) accepted by local consignment stores, 2) picked up by charities (check web sites), or 3) dropped off at one of the many collection boxes in Hopewell Valley, e.g., the outdoor boxes at all six schools of the Hopewell Valley Regional School District (hvrsd.org/textiles). The HVRSD boxes accept clothing regardless of quality (items must be dry, but stains and rips are no problem), as well as **sheets, blankets, curtains, towels, scrap fabric, pillows, stuffed toys, gloves, hats, handbags, belts and shoes** (but no carpet).

Clothes Hangers: Dry cleaners may take metal hangers back for reuse. Clothing stores can reuse hangers that are left at the store.

Furniture: HomeFront homefrontnj.org/donate-food-furniture-and-clothing, Habitat ReStore habitat.org/restores/donate-goods

Ink Cartridges: Staples, Office Depot/Office Max.

Leaves and Brush: Check with Public Works in your municipality.

Medical Equipment: goodwillhomemedical.org/equipment-donation.

Medication: 24/7 Drop off box at the Hopewell Township Police Department. njconsumeraffairs.gov/meddrop.

Plastic Bags and Film Packaging: clean, dry plastic bags and film, free of food residue, are accepted by many stores, e.g., participants in

the Trex program (e.g., Stop and Shop; see trex.com/recycling) accept a wide range of plastic bags and film packaging, including **bread bags, bubble wrap, case wrap, dry cleaning bags, grocery bags, ice bags, newspaper sleeves, plastic wrap around many products (e.g., around paper towels, napkins, etc.), produce bags, and zip-lock bags**. Peel or cut off paper labels before dropping off your bags/film.

Plastic Bottles, Containers and Lids with a ♻️ Symbol:

Preserve’s Gimme 5 Program (preserve.eco). Drop off clean number 5 plastic at the Whole Foods Market in Princeton or the Pennington Farmers Market (see “Events”), or mail it to Preserve.

Plastic Plant Trays, Pots and Tags: Lowe’s Garden Centers.

Refrigerators and Freezers: njcleanenergy.com, \$50 rebate, schedule pick-up online or call 866 657-6278. Room air conditioner and/or dehumidifier can be picked up along with a fridge or freezer.

Stuffed Toys: see “Clothes and Shoes” above.

Styrofoam Egg Containers: see “Events” Pennington Farmers Market and Hopewell Valley Green Team.

Styrofoam Packing Peanuts: Take back to shipping stores for reuse, e.g., Popcorn Packers in Pennington, UPS stores, or Mail Boxes Etc.

Styrofoam Shipping Blocks: see “Events” Hopewell Valley Green Team. Shipping blocks can also be dropped off at Princeton Moulding, 76 Fourth Street, Somerville NJ. Call ahead to make sure they will be open: 908 291-1180. This facility will also accept Styrofoam food containers if they are very clean and separate from other Styrofoam.

Tires: drop off at Mavis Discount Tire, Pennington (\$1.50/tire); for curbside pick-up, check with your Public Works department.

Vehicle Waste (batteries, engine oil, hydraulic oil, transmission fluid): pepboys.com/auto-care/lifestyle/earth-day

Yard Waste: Compost in your backyard (see Food Scraps) and/or use municipal pick-up programs (for Hopewell and Pennington Boroughs).

Other Tips

Join a local Freecycle group at freecycle.org (e.g., Trenton and/or Princeton) and find a good home for what you no longer need.

Buy products made from recycled materials.
